Property EnhancementsLandscape and Common Areas

Over the past few months Windham HOA implemented several landscape enhancements:

1. Hillsides by Jefferson Apartments – planted red fescue grass near bldgs: 12037, 12041, 12031, 12015, and near mailbox area (though as you can see, "red" fescue is green! (3)).



 Front Entrance – spread lantana throughout, replacing the dying red apple ground cover



3. Courtyard #2 (bldg. 12073) – introduced inner ring of drought-tolerant kurapia surrounded by rye grass. So far is looking great!



4. <u>BBQ Area</u> – changed out three planters with succulents vs. annuals for longer life and visual aesthetic.



5. <u>Pool Bathroom Entrance</u> – placed new plantings on both sides of entrance way



6. Parking Island #1 - scattered rosemary



Resident ParkingPermit Parking vs. Guest Parking

Based on a review of resident needs, the HOA established two additional *resident-exemption permit* parking spaces within Windham. These spaces are clearly marked both on the asphalt area and on the curb.

Trash Pickup Rulesfor Timely Haul-Out & Haul-In!

Residents have noticed several trash bins being left outside much longer than necessary, which is not only unsightly but often an inconvenience to others navigating their narrow driveways and garages.

Please note rule 5D on page 5 of Windham "Rules and Regulations": "Garbage and trash shall be kept in closed, sanitary containers at all times. Garbage containers shall not be put out prior to 7pm on the night prior to scheduled pick-up and shall be removed within 12 hours after collection." We sincerely ask for your cooperation in adhering to this rule – thank you!

Board Member OpeningInterested in Serving the HOA?

We still have a vacancy on the Board of Directors at Windham. As you know, the Windham HOA is comprised of homeowners within the community who volunteer and are elected to serve, so the current vacancy term will be appointed by the existing Board members and will be in effect until October 2020. At that time elections will be held during the annual meeting for three of the five Board member positions, for a two-year term.



Serving on the Board can be a rewarding experience. It provides the opportunity to make a difference in your community and to assist how the Windham HOA is run. Board members volunteer to serve by performing such duties as: reviewing financials, including operating and reserve accounts and budgets, evaluating contractors necessary to run and maintain the association, enforcing the CC&Rs, Rules & Regulations, and Architectural Standards/Guidelines, and following requirements as detailed in the CC&Rs and the law pertaining to operating and maintaining the association.

M.O.W. San Diego County offers the choice of one or two nutritious meals for seven days a week, including holidays. Deliveries are made by caring volunteers between 10:45 am and 1:30 pm. Sunday meals are delivered on Saturday.

Meals on Wheels San Diego County subsidizes 60% of the costs for meals, delivery, and other services provided, regardless of a senior's ability to pay.
